Proposed Waiting Restrictions on Regis Road.



From the Chaplain....

This week we have welcomed back one another and our new colleagues and pupils and we have been considering what it means to belong and be know as we have reflected on the words of Psalm 139 together. David, who started out life as a shepherd boy but rose to become the best-known King of Israel, clearly had a very personal and intimate relationship with God in which he recognised God's total knowledge of his innermost thoughts and complete care for him throughout his life.

`Even before Id speak, you already know what I will say...your knowledge of me is too deep, it is beyond my understanding`, he says. There is comfort in being so deeply loved and understood., though there are also things about ourselves we would choose not to share with others, because they scare us or we find them painful or embarrassing. But we were not created to live in isolation; we were created as relational beings. Opening our hearts to loving other people and to being loved by them does leave us vulnerable to being hurt, to having our hearts broken from time to time, but the alternative is an unbearable loneliness. God's promise to us is that he loves us deeply, no matter what, and that he will never abandon us.

Last night we heard the sad news that our Queen, Elizabeth, had died at home in Balmoral; and this morning we gathered as a school to remember her. The Queen has been a constant presence throughout our lives as with quiet dignity she has served her people through decades of change and at times unprecedented upheaval. She has shown loyalty, discretion, wisdom in counsel and integrity in her untiring work. And whilst being almost universally recognised and known by millions of people, very few will have known her really well. The life of a monarch must surely be a very lonely one. We are thankful that Queen Elizabeth knew the love and deep friendship of Prince Philip and we know that her faith in God was a great encouragement and a source of strength and inspiration to her throughout her life.

Loving God,

We give you thanks for the new school year and for the new opportunities it will offer for learning, for growth, and for friend-ship. We thank you also for the life and service of Queen Elizabeth, for her faith in you and for her loyal service to her people. We ask your guidance for our nation and for the Commonwealth and your comfort for all those who mourn her today and in the weeks to come.

As we welcome our pupils back to school this week we remember that each one is precious and deeply loved by God.
