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From the Chaplain....

As we continue to follow the story of David from the Old Testament, we have heard this week of his close friendship with Jonathan, in which Jonathan was willing to stand up for David against the unjustified wrath and jealousy of his own dad, King Saul. Reflecting on this we have heard other amazing stories of loyalty during the week, as well as some quite personal accounts. It has become clear that the bond of friendship can run very deep and motivate extraordinary acts of generosity and of loyalty. I wonder what difference it has made in our own lives to have a friend there who we could rely on in times of trouble or difficulty?

The art of letter writing is something which seems to have almost disappeared over the last couple of decades, but in my early adulthood, whilst living and travelling abroad and a long way from home, letters from friends and family made a huge difference to me. Despite the excitement of living abroad, the feeling of freedom and independence, there were certainly times when living a long way from those who knew me best and spoke the same language as me (literally) was a very lonely experience. It made my day to receive letters from friends and it was even more wonderful when some of them made the long journey out to visit me. As they say, 'A friend in need is a friend indeed!'

Even without that contact from home, I was struck by the welcome I received as a foreigner in another country. People who didn't know me often went out of their way to share a kind word or even to invite me to eat with them. The feeling of being a long way from my comfort zone and the kindness of strangers who went out of their way to make me feel welcome was an experience which has stayed with me. Every day we encounter and pass by people who are feeling isolated. I wonder what we can do to offer a word of friendship to someone who needs to know they are not alone today?

As we follow the story of David we consider the blessing of having a loyal friend.
