



Dear Parents and Carers

In order to support your child to make further progress in the build-up to their Yr 10 exams, I would like to share with you all that we have in place to assist your child and their revision over the next few weeks. We have several exciting opportunities and experiences planned to make sure they are best prepared for their Yr 10 exams which will provide a good indication of their progress this year, and ahead of their Pre-Public Examinations (mock exams) in the Autumn Term in Yr 11.

Year 10 Summer Challenge

To motivate all pupils to be the best they can be, we have launched the Yr 10 Summer Challenge which will run until the 1st July. Pupils will be competing against each other to try and gain a place on a reward trip to Alton Towers in July. The criteria has been set will be to improve independence, organisation and self -discipline for learning. These are all skills that will not only prepare them for what is to come over the next 12 months but also when they enter the work place.

Each week pupils will have the chance to gain a maximum of 10 positive points as outlined below.

1 point each for:

- 100% punctuality to school and to lessons.
- Correct school uniform
- Equipped to learn
- Form Tutor Star of the Week (nominated by the Form Tutor).

2 points each for:

- 100% attendance to school
- 100% positive behaviour ratio
- Top 10 GCSE Pod Check and Challenge

It's going to be a very busy few months for Year 10 getting them ready and best prepared for what is in store in 12 months' time. There will be lots of opportunities for pupils to recover knowledge lost because of the pandemic, develope and enhance their revision skills and to gain aspiration for their future after education.

Monday 23rd May—Elevate seminar.

Year 10 will be invited to an hour long *Ace Your Exam's* session by the award winning Elevate Education. Elevate have worked with 3,000 schools across the UK, aiming to equip students with the skills they need to improve their results. During the session they will learn how to improve exam preparation, fixing mistakes, allocation of time and exam room techniques.

This will be a great opportunity for pupils to develop more self-belief and improve necessary skills to excel in their PPE and final GCSE exams.

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Thursday 26th May 2022- Year 10 Parents Information Evening

This will be an opportunity for Year Parents/Carers to come into school and meet with Senior Leadership Team and myself to receive important information regarding pupil exams in June and beyond. As well as guidance on how to support your child through their exams, revision techniques and GCSEpod, there will be an opportunity to ask any questions you may have, order revision guides, collect revision topic lists and your child's exam timetable.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on this important evening.

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Food Parcel Support May Half-Term 30th May to 5th June 2022.

Dear Parent/Carer

We are writing to let you know that children and young people entitled to benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM) are being offered support during the May 2022 half-term holiday week.

Eligible children will be able to collect a free food parcel, funded through the City of Wolverhampton Council's Household Support Fund.

To access this support, your child must be in Reception to Year 11 inclusive, attending a qualifying Wolverhampton school or Academy and have a current/protected benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM) in place.

You will need to register your interest online at www.wolverhampton.gov.uk/May between Friday 6th and Sunday 15th May 2022 inclusive, if your child is attending a qualifying setting in Wolverhampton and:

- Your child has a current/protected FSM claim in place; or
- You meet the statutory eligibility criteria for benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM), not Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)

If you don't meet these requirements, please contact us to discuss your circumstances in confidence.

If you don't have access to the internet, or don't have an email address you can apply by calling the <u>Stay Safe Be Kind</u> helpline on 01902 290241 during office hours between Monday 9th and Friday 13th May 2022 inclusive. If you call before Monday 9th May 2022, they will not be able to help you with your application.

Food parcels will contain ingredients for five lunches and breakfasts and will need to be collected. A list of venues, dates and times for food parcel collection will be shared with successful applicants.

The deadline to apply is Sunday 15th May 2022. If you do not apply before this date, your child/ren will not be able to access this support during the May 2022 half –term holiday week, even if they are eligible to receive benefits-related Free School Meals (FSM) during term-time.

Support is available to all residents of the City of Wolverhampton in need at this time. 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
From the Chaplain....

When I was at university I spent a summer working in the mountains on the French-Swiss border. Out walking with a friend one day we met a shepherd, spending the summer months with a flock of sheep in the mountain pastures. He knew just which wildflowers would make his sheep drowsy, he knew how to catch and treat them if they were limping and he knew how to gauge quickly if any of the flock were missing. He also had two sheep dogs to help him, one of which was bilingual!

When Jesus told the parable of the lost sheep, his listeners would have been familiar with sheep and their habit of wandering off and getting stuck. Sheep are actually very intelligent and curious creatures but, just like us, they are well known for getting in trouble – tangled in a hedge or stuck in a bog. I don't know if you have ever come across a sheep in trouble and tried to help it, but they are prone to panicking and making things worse. Does that sound familiar? One thing is certain: we don't see a sheep in trouble and grumble about how evil it is and how it deserves punishment, do we? The sheep has just done what sheep do. So we can imagine the caring shepherd sighing to himself as he sets out once again to find and rescue the lost sheep, knowing that it will probably wander off again next week and the week after.

It strikes me that as human beings we can be quick to judge one another for losing our way in life at times and perhaps we sometimes look down at our fellow humans in trouble thinking that they have brought disaster on themselves by the choices they have made in life. Well, this may be true, but then isn't that what we humans tend to do? Make wrong choices at times and lose our way? According to our parable this week, God the good shepherd, far from wanting to judge and punish us, simply wants to gather us up and bring us back to the safety and comfort of the flock. And when he does, he rejoices.

Not only is this a tremendous tale of good news for us all, but it is also a challenge to us to look more kindly and more generously on one another when we get ourselves in trouble. So much of Jesus' time was spent in bringing people who had been isolated back into the fold of society... can we perhaps look for opportunities to do the same? After all, God just wants to bless us and love us and to see us flourish.
