

Yr 9, and Angelica Yr 10 who finished in 4th and 6th of their categories, a fantastic achievement! Well done!



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




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Year 11 Parent's Evening

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From the Chaplain....

'Bees make honey, but what is the point of wasps?' I have sometimes heard people ask. And I myself have gone into the garden to find a crop of young seedlings has been devoured overnight and wondered 'What is the point of slugs?' But I am assured that both wasps and slugs and indeed every other creature and plant, however tiny, plays an important role in ecology and is depended on by other species. Our lives would be poorer without them.

Our reflections this week have been based on the assertion that we were created to be unique, each one with unique gifts and talents to be used for the benefit of others. This includes material gifts, and over this fortnight we are bringing gifts of food for our harvest appeal, to be donated to foodbanks in the city. None of us knows when we ourselves might need the support of others, and we are aware that there are more people than ever needing a helping hand with their bills or with feeding their families at the moment. But it also includes our skills, our experience and our personal qualities... some of which we develop or discover later in our lives. In the parable of the talents, in fact, those servants who used their talents grew and developed more, but the servant who hid his talent had it taken from him.

So what is it that causes us to hide our talents at times, or what puts us off from trying new things and potentially discovering talents? Perhaps it is simple humility: we don't want to draw attention to ourselves and feel uncomfortable promoting ourselves. In teenagers there is often such a strong desire to fit in and not stand out that it can lead many to keeping quiet about the skills and qualities they possess.

In his first letter to the Corinthians, the apostle Paul said that each person was like a part of a body and in order for them to flourish, each one was needed. Each has a unique role to play in the health and well-being of the whole of society. Let us be open to noticing, celebrating and encouraging the gifts in those people around us and let us be generous in using and sharing our own gifts for the benefit of all. But let us also remember that we were not created to live in isolation, and that there are times too when we should be gracious in accepting the help and encouragement offered by other people.

We consider this week the unique gifts each of us has been given to grow and to share.
