Dear Parent/Carer,

I would like to invite you to attend the Year 9 Parents' and Options Evening, which will take place at school on Wednesday 25th January from 4:30 until 7:00pm to include an important presentation by our Senior Leadership Team at 5.30pm.

This is a very important date in the school calendar because it is an opportunity to meet with subject teachers and for them to share the interim report on your child's progress. This is also a particularly important evening because we will be sharing the Guided Options Process with you and your child. In Year 10 and Year 11 students take a number of compulsory subjects as well as choosing other subjects from a range of options. We will share information at the Parents' Evening to support your child in making choices suitable to their interests, abilities and ambitions. As parents and carers your help in supporting this process is essential; we hope you will make this evening a priority.

During the Parents' and Options Evening there will be an opportunity to:

- Meet with your child's subject teachers. This is a good opportunity to discuss the results of the recent Year 9 exams as well as discussing your child's suitability to study specific subjects at KS4.
- Find out more about the KS4 options process.
- Meet with the Senior Leadership Team and I should you have any queries.

To support you in attending this evening, we will be running a minibus from Whitmore Reans. Please indicate on the reply slip that has been emailed if you would like to book a place on the minibus. Further to this, we can also offer some support in translating when talking with the teachers. Please indicate on the reply slip if you would like assistance and which language you require translating.

I would be grateful if you could complete and return the parental response form to your child's Form Tutor by **Monday 23rd** January.

We are providing each child with pre-booked appointment slots to ensure you can see as many teachers as possible.

I would like to thank you for your ongoing support and look forward to meeting you. Your attendance will help us to ensure that your child makes as much progress as possible throughout the academic year and makes informed choices about their future.

Whilst a storm raged around him, experienced sailors panicked and did all they could to save the ship from breaking up and Jonah lay fast asleep. How was Jonah able to sleep through such a violent storm? Surely this wasn't the peaceful sleep of a righteous man?

Jonah, in trying to escape the task God had set him, had just travelled sixty miles in the opposite direction and boarded a boat to Tarshish. So perhaps this was the exhausted sleep of a man who thought he was at last safe? Or perhaps this was the despondent 'shutting himself away from the world' of a man who couldn't see a hopeful way forwards? Certainly when danger threatened to overtake them and the sailors became anxious, Jonah didn't seem to care; he remained firmly ensconced in his cabin. This prophet, this man with a message from God, had to be woken up, brought to his senses and encouraged to pray by men who didn't even recognise or know 'the Lord. The God of heaven who made the sea and the dry land' (Jonah 1:9). It was as if they had more faith than him.

To be fair to Jonah, he quickly owned up to what he had done and took responsibility for the predicament they found themselves in. Jonah even went as far as to suggest throwing him overboard so that the storm would calm down. Yet again, the foreign sailors showed their care by doing all they could to avoid such drastic measures; but despite their best efforts there seemed no alternative. Even as they threw him into the sea, the sailors cried out for mercy to the God of Jonah, the God of the Hebrews. Moreover, when the sea at once calmed down, they recognised the immense power of Jonah's God and promised to serve him.

Let us continue to look out for what God is saying to us this week, through the chaotic storms that sometimes cause us turmoil, through those who don't even know him, through actions and events which are not of his doing; because there is no end to his creativity and ability to teach us his ways.
