

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

I would like to invite you to attend the Year 11 Careers Fair on Wednesday 22nd March, 4pm-6pm and Year 11 Parents' Evening on Wednesday 29th March 2023, 4.30pm-7.30pm.

These are both very important dates in the school calendar for Year 11 pupils and provides an opportunity for you and your child to meet with post-16 providers such as apprenticeships, universities and colleges, and meet with subject teachers to discuss their progress and attainment ahead of the forthcoming GCSE Examinations.

Pupils will be receiving their PPE results during the parents evening and therefore your attendance is essential as the results will provide the foundation for your face-to-face progress conversations, where subject teachers will discuss how best pupils can prepare for their GCSE examinations next term. The Examinations Manager will be available to address any queries parents/carers may have.

We are keen to work closely with parents/carers to support and secure the best outcomes for every child in Year 11 and your attendance at the Parents' Evening is critical in ensuring we work together to ensure your child makes as much progress as possible throughout the next few months.

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From the Chaplain....

'We have been made right, in God's sight, by faith' asserts Saint Paul in his letter to the church in Rome, our school text for this week. And when we consider what that means, it is life-changing.

On several occasions I have met people who have told me: 'God can't possibly love me.' People who bear a heavy burden of guilt for their past actions. People who feel defined by their mistakes and unlovable or undeserving as a result.

The Christian hope and joy stems from a belief that we will not be judged on our actions in this life, but on whether we put our trust in God's promise to us and in his abundant grace. We recognise that none of us have lived up to God's high standards... all of us have fallen short at times; and yet day by day, God gives us the opportunity to have the slate wiped clean and to return into full relationship with him, pure in his sight. Isn't it amazing to think that the God of eternity, who created the whole universe, cares enough about each one of us to make that offer? Indeed, enough to take our guilt and our punishment on himself in order that he might restore us into a loving relationship with him? Because God doesn't want us to go through life weighed down by guilt and feeling unworthy. God wants us to be able to enjoy life in all its fulness; to laugh and to weep, to love, to be creative and to flourish.

Does this mean that our actions and the choices we make don't matter to God? Of course not. If we have faith in him and accept his great love for us then we will want to be involved in what he is doing and become the people he created us to be. And his work is all about restoration and renewal of life.

As we look around us in the world and in our communities we might ask ourselves where we can see God at work. Where can we see life being renewed, the relationships being mended, the environment being restored? And then, we might ask ourselves: how can we join in?

'But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.' Isaiah 40:31
