

Mr Shoukat has made sure all props are in working order!



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

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From the Chaplain....

Just a week ago we heard the news of yet another tragic loss of many lives as a boat carrying hundreds of desperate migrants sank off the coast of Greece. But how much do we know about the stories of those who were travelling and the thousands like them who risk their lives each year in search of a place of refuge, safety and hope for their families? And who do we listen to when we want to know more?



This week in Refugee Week, and an opportunity to listen and to share the real-

life stories of refugees and their experiences. An opportunity also to imagine and to consider the challenges they have faced but also the skills and gifts they have to offer.

The Hummingbird Project is a Brighton based charity speaking out for refugees and asylum seekers whose voices are so often ignored. Their 'Young Leaders' work empowers young people to tell their stories and communicate their needs. This work was inspired when volunteers noticed how often decisions were being made about the futures of children and young people by a range of different agencies, yet without the children themselves being in the room to speak for themselves.

This week at school we reflect on the apostle Stephen who was arrested and eventually stoned to death for speaking the truth. Often the truth is uncomfortable to hear. Often, speaking the truth can make us unpopular. Throughout both the Old and New Testaments, there are examples of prophets and apostles who were rejected and despised for speaking the truth. And things haven't changed today. We know the opposition faced by those like Malala Yousafzai and Greta Thunberg who speak up with a message unpopular by some of those in power.

Immigration is a highly contentious political topic and there seems to be a lot of pressure on politicians, who want to win votes, to act drastically to cut immigration, at any cost. But before we make our minds up about their policies and plans, are we willing to listen to every aspect of the story? Are we willing to listen to the stories of those seeking places of safety?



The theme of Refugee Week this year is 'Compassion' and we are all invited to listen, to watch and to share a story this week.
