

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Year 9 Online Parents' Evening, Wednesday 9th February between 5-7pm.

Dear Parents & Carers

I would like to invite you to attend the **VIRTUAL Year 9 Parents' and Options Evening**, which will take place using our School Cloud platform **Wednesday 9th February from 5.00pm until 7.00pm**.

This is a very important date in the school calendar because it is an opportunity to meet with subject teachers and for them to share the interim report on your child's progress. This is also a particularly important evening because we will be sharing the **Guided Options Process** with you and your child – and these will also be shared virtually (link to follow in an email prior to the event).

In Year 10 students take a number of compulsory subjects (English, Maths, Science and RE) as well as choosing other subjects from a range of options at GCSE and BTEC. We will share information at the Parents Evening to support your child in making choices suitable to their interests, abilities and ambitions. As parents and carers your help in supporting this process is essential; we hope therefore that you will make this evening a priority.

We would ask that you book your subject appointments in advance using our School Cloud Portal.

School Cloud

This allows you to choose your own five-minute appointment times with teachers. Please be aware that we have to limit the number of appointments each teacher can make within the two-hour time slot so please book as soon as possible. As Head of Year you can book to see myself and also Mr Cox-Darling our lead SEND teacher.

Appointments can be made from **9.00am on Tuesday 1 st February and will close 3.30pm on Tuesday 8th February**. Should you wish to make any changes after this date please contact the school office.

How to book an appointment with your child's teacher

Step 1: Visit the 'Parent' section of our school website and click on school cloud in the menu.

https://www.kingswolverhampton.co.uk/schoolcloud to book your appointments. A short guide on how to add appointments is included.

Step 2: Login to school cloud using **your email and your child's name**. Select your child's teachers and book an appointment time with them. You will receive a confirmation email with your chosen times. When you login again at parents' evening you will be able to click the appointment and speak with that teacher.

Important: If we do not have your parent email on file you will not be able to access the booking system.

Please contact Mr Rogers (r.rogers@kingswolverhampton.co.uk) as soon as possible and provide it so we can update our records. If you do not have access to the internet, please contact the school office (01902 558333) and we will try and provide an alternative option for you. I would like to thank you for your ongoing support and we look forward to meeting you online on February 9th. Your attendance will help us to ensure that your child makes as much progress as possible throughout the academic year and makes informed choices about their future.

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From the Chaplain....

In our worship this week our school community are reflecting on an amazing act of mercy. Though King Saul was hunting him down and wanting to kill him, when David came across the King in a particularly vulnerable position, he chose to be merciful. Instead of killing or threatening Saul, he approached him with loyalty and mercy. What would happen if we were all to treat those who had offended us with such generosity and compassion? And what is it that stops us?

I suspect that what stops us is our pride and our fear. We might feel quite rightly angry or indignant about the way we have been treated and struggle to put aside our hurt pride in order to repair the relationship. We are afraid to look weak and to risk the pain of further abuse or insult. It is natural to want to protect ourselves from being hurt again, and so we might give in to that fear which causes us to withdraw from the other. Perhaps we might even use unkindness to hold at a distance the person who has caused us offence and to build a protective wall around ourselves. This way leads ultimately to fragmentation and isolation with a focus on individuals rather than that which we all have in common.


So how do we live out our belief that we are a community and that we belong together? How do we give expression to our belief that we are all God's children, created in his image and loved by him? In response to the commandment to 'love your neighbour', when asked, 'Who is my neighbour?' Jesus told a controversial story, which would have turned the social wisdom of the day on its head. The 'good Samaritan', who showed compassion and mercy to the robbers' victim, totally disregarded generations of enmity between the Samaritans and the Jews and in doing so he not only showed mercy but he also created the conditions for healing to take place.

Mercy and generosity are acts of love. Perhaps in our attempts to be more generous and loving we might pray that our eyes are opened both to the many ways in which God blesses and pours out his love on us and also to recognising and treating with dignity the image of God which is present in the other.

Amen

We read of David showing mercy to Saul and consider the difference generosity and forgiveness might make in our lives.
