





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From the Chaplain....

'What difference does prayer make?' we ask ourselves this week, as we read the amazing story in Acts 12 of Peter being set free from prison, much to the initial disbelief of the band of believers who were gathered together praying for him. And many of us might be able to tell stories of prayer being answered in miraculous ways: of healing, of reconciliation or of help being provided when it was most needed. But if we are honest, we will also be able to point to times or situations where we have questioned why God does not seem to be putting everything right and prayers don't seem to have been answered... at least yet. So what difference does prayer make?

When God created humankind in his image, he gave us some of his characteristics: imagination and creativity, hope and compassion; and he called us to join him and to be co-creators with him. He did not make us mere puppets to do his bidding with no will of our own and neither did he make us solitary beings, cut off from himself and from one another to find our own ways in life. Just as the Christian God is community: Father, Son and Holy Spirit; so he called us into community with him. For me, prayer is a vessel for being community with God. In prayer I can 'pour out my heart' (as one of our pupils said this week), I can lament or rejoice, I can tell God my concerns and know that he is interested, I can ask for his help or thank him for his blessings already received. And I can listen.

Last week I left you with a quote from Mother Teresa, which included the words: I used to believe that prayer changes things, but now I know that prayer changes us and we change things. Perhaps as we pray this week, as we share with God all that is in our hearts and all that we desire, we can try to be aware of the change that our prayer is producing in us. And then as we go about our daily lives we can continue to listen and to notice where God is calling us to be, what he is calling us to say and where he is calling us to act.
