

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#### From the Chaplain....

Imagine being reliant on others for every aspect of your life. The lame man in Acts chapter 3 had to rely on friends to carry him to the Temple every day, where he would beg for money to feed himself. He could not work or contribute to society and as such would have had little hope of ever marrying or having a family. His lack of 'use' to society would have guaranteed him the lowest status in the community. When Peter and John approached him that day and looked right at him, not averting their gaze as so may others did in embarrassment or disgust, he stretched out his hands eager for whatever coins they had to spare.

"We have no money" Peter told him, "but we will give you what we do have", and with that they invited him to stand up and walk, in the name of Jesus Christ. His disciples would have seen Jesus performing healing miracles like this numerous times, but with Jesus now gone from sight, returned to his Father, I wonder what it was that gave Peter and John the confidence to trust in the power he had passed on to them in the Holy Spirit and to utter these words? Do we have the same confidence when called upon to use the gifts we have been given? And if not, then what causes us to hesitate?

One of the highlights of my week is to hear the thoughts of colleagues from across the school inspired by our weekly Bible readings and themes. The thoughts are sometimes personal, usually very inspiring and always spoken from the heart. I know that colleagues think long and hard about what they are going to share and that the process of sharing takes many of us out of our comfort zones. I am immensely grateful to all those who agree to take a turn on the rota knowing that we appreciate the variety of voices and thoughts which are shared... it is such an encouraging way to start the day!



Because Peter and John were willing to take a risk that day a man's life was change. Because they were willing to use the gift they had been given, other people witnessed the power of God in action. Not only was one man healed, but the whole community was affected.
