Thank you for your support throughout this term; it has been a very busy term and there is much to celebrate in the life of the school. There has been a growing sense of normality this second half term as we have enjoyed being able to gather again in person for House Worship in school and to have more trips and enrichment activities taking place.

The report from our Ofsted monitoring visit, earlier this term, has now been published on the Ofsted website. This report affirms the school leadership in the progress being made, and recognises that the school is well on the way to being an outstanding school. We have also celebrated the recognition of being a school of sanctuary and we continue to welcome pupils from around the world who thrive in our community. All our pupils took part in writing their story to The King's because your story; The King's story.

As a school we have achieved a lot his half term. Our year 11 and 13 students have just completed their second set of Pre-Public Exams in preparation for their summer exams. The school has employed a strong team of Professional Tutors in response to the Department for Education's National Tutoring Covid recovery programme. It has been so good to meet again with parents and carers and our year 8 parents' evening this week was very well attended and supported by teaching staff, Mr Cox-Darling, our SEND Co-ordinator, Mrs Badger our Safeguarding manager and Mrs Douglas as Head of Year. We also enjoyed the return of Choirs in Reflection this term with the theme "Living in Harmony" which is part of our school's vision and also very relevant for our current world. It was also a joy to be able to come to gather again at St Michael and All Angels' yesterday for our Easter services which were led by the students.

At the end of this term we are saying thank you and farewell to Mrs Morgan-Jones and Miss Crone. Mrs Morgan-Jones has been at The King's for seven years, although had worked at the school previously for nine years, so a total of sixteen years. We are grateful for all she has done for our pupils during her time at the school. We do wish Mrs Morgan-Jones and Miss Crone all the very best in their new roles.

There is so much to celebrate and be thankful for at The King's as we have reflected on during this season of Lent. As we break up today for the Easter holiday, we do wish all our pupils and families a very Happy Easter as we reflect on the hope from the Easter story and the events during Holy week. We also wish everyone celebrating, a Happy Baisakhi, which falls during the next two weeks.

The summer term starts on Monday 25th April for all pupils and we will look forward to seeing all our pupils back in school.





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From the Chaplain....

Last week in our thoughts we remembered Jesus being cheered as he entered Jerusalem... but this week we heard about the crowds turning against him and calling for him to suffer an agonising and humiliating death whilst a murderer was set free. What a change in public opinion! We have been asking ourselves, 'Why did Jesus have to die?' and 'What does Jesus' death mean to us personally?'

In our House Worship this week, our friends from All Nations Church talked to us about what Jesus' death means to them and about the power of forgiveness. Christians, like other religions, recognise that as human beings we are capable of thoughts, words and deeds which are hurtful both to other people and to God. We believe that God has a better way for us to live and we pray that we might be better at following his lead, but at the same time we recognise that we get things wrong on a daily basis. So are we doomed to feeling guilty and deserving punishment for eternity?

Perhaps unlike other religions, Christians don't believe that being 'right' with God is achievable by our trying hard to act in the right way. The only way we can be 'right' with God is through our belief and through his grace and forgiveness. The power of the cross for Christians is the power of love over evil, the power of life over death. And our God is a God who wants nothing more than to see us flourish. "For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)

As trees that a month ago looked dead are now covered in blossom, as the bare earth is now dotted with flowering bulbs, as new green shoots appear and the birds sing out and build nests; so the symbols of spring remind us that no matter how dark the days of winter, life and light return once more. The Easter message for me is a message of hope. It is the invitation to accept the gift of life in all its fullness. And it is the knowledge that whatever happens in between, God has already triumphed over evil and all shall be well.
