Equality & Accessibilities Policy

At King's School ("the School") it is our aim to provide a broad based education for all our pupils irrespective of special needs, gender, disability, sexual orientation or race. Our policy pays due regard to the legislation in this area including the Equality Act (2010), the Children and Families Act (2014), the Special Education Needs (SEN) Code of Practice (2014), and the Disability Discrimination Act (1995). The School will seek to:

1 Provide a broad and balanced education for every child

We will ensure that every child can access the full National Curriculum in KS3. As a pupil moves into KS4 and KS5 we will offer an increasingly personalised curriculum to meet individual aptitudes and skills. Our SEND department will support teachers in meeting the needs of children on the SEND register.

2 Provide pastoral support for every child

All pupils will have citizenship lessons as part of the taught curriculum and assemblies will also be used to promote spiritual, moral and social development. Inclusion is promoted as part of our Citizenship programme. In addition to our pastoral team, pupil behaviour unit, school counsellor and chaplaincy team we will access a range of local services to support the individual needs of pupils.

3 Ensure our site is accessible to every child

All pupils are able to access the classrooms and facilities around the site and special arrangements will be made for those with physical disabilities on an individual basis.

4 Provide information to staff, pupils, parents and members of the local community

All School policies and other relevant information will be listed on the school website. Parents may access copies of pupil reward files and requests for information will be dealt with according to the Freedom of Information and Data Protection policies. We will issue a regular newsletter to parents and a weekly student bulletin and staff bulletin to ensure relevant information is shared widely and disseminated as widely as possible.
