Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a very busy, but wonderful, half term with so much going on in school. I can't believe how quickly this half term has seemed to go and that we are at the final Friday before half term. The Year 11s and 13s have made an incredibly positive start to their exams and I hope they manage to enjoy some down time during their studies in the next week before the exams restart. In addition to the bank holidays, this half term we have also enjoyed Year 8 and 11 visits to Shrewsbury and Kenilworth respectively, our re-arranged Easter concert, our annual Diversity Day, a joint 6th Form Open Evening with St. Peter's school and Year 7 and 8 students have had the opportunity to take part in the Bike Ability scheme. Lots of wonderful and positive experiences for our students and I want to thank all of our staff for their continued hard work and support in offering these.

Our new catering service, Innovate, have been in school for 2 half terms now and as I have said previously, we are keen to receive, and then respond, to any feedback we get from parents and students regarding this important service. Last week I met with Innovate and you should shortly be receiving an electronic survey link in order to provide us with detailed feedback. We have also spoken to Innovate about reviewing their pricing and also have now secured a daily water station in the canteen offering students free, naturally flavoured water.

We have also paid to have three brand new water fountains fitted in the canteen, so students have regular access to fresh drinking water. As a result, and also in an effort to reduce our reliance on single use plastics, we are encouraging students to bring with them reusable water bottles with them to school so they can fill them up as required. After half term we aim to have some brand-new school branded water bottles available to purchase at a discounted price.





After half term we enter our final half term of the academic year! We have lots going on with external exams, Year 12 Residential, Year 13 rewards trip, Year 11 Prom, Year 6 transition, a range of external visits for different year groups, Pride of King's Award evening and our End of Year show. Sports day is also scheduled for Wednesday 12th July.



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From the Chaplain....

At The King's CE School we believe that everyone is unique and created in God's image. We wrote our school vision a few years ago now and I remember that there was some conversation at the time around the exact choice of words. His is a love which stays with us, biding his time whilst we distract ourselves with fruitless or even harmful activities, and waits until we ready to recognise and accept him. And this amazing love is for all.

How can we become a part of what God is doing? How can we be the ones who empower and encourage others?
