

Our theme for this year was, Christ's Kingdom: Our Response. Each year group focused on a different part of our vision statement and grappled with a Big Question related to the theme.

Year 7's were considering what it means to be part of a Church of England school. They reflected on their own stories, made Christmas cards for our local community and learned about prayer and reflection through an interactive workshop led by All Nations Church.

Year 9's were learning important teamwork and leadership skills as part of The National Enterprise Day. This challenged and encouraged all to work as a "harmonious community", as well as developing our school values of empathy, respect and responsibility.

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From the Chaplain....

What a busy and exciting week it has been in our school worship life. On Tuesday we marked the Feast of Christ the King together with a full day of activities and opportunities: to experience different prayer spaces, to debate how science and faith complement one another, to think about our roles in creating a just society and to focus on achieving our God-given potential and flourishing as the people God created us to be. We started the day by pausing together as a school to consider what it means for Christ to be King and for us to live together according to his values. There were lovely contributions from Rev Douglas and from members of the school, both staff and pupils.

Our House Worship this week has been led by our Sixth Form students who have helped us to consider the meaning of advent. We have thought about what it means to wait in hopeful expectation and about how we sometimes need to lay down some of the busyness and the various tasks we are juggling, in order to make space in our lives to listen and to prepare for the blessings that God wants to pour out on us in the future.

Our reading from Malachi 3 reminds us of God's promise that the day will come when he will wipe away all the suffering and pain from the world and that we will be left pure and cleansed: when God's Kingdom is finally established all shall be well, the way he created and intended it to be. If we make the time to watch, to wait and to notice, we can start to see how God is already at work in the world and in our communities, healing and restoring people and situations.

But God's work isn't yet completed, and we are called to join him in bringing hope into the world. Our sixth form charity committee are taking a lead on our Advent Appeal this year. The Tear Fund appeal entitled 'Reboot' is about raising money for those who are most severely affected by climate change; so that with education and resources they might build more resilient homes and livelihoods to withstand the worst of the disaster which is destroying lives in the poorest communities of the world. Meanwhile, we are all encouraged to pray and to consider the changes we can make in our own lives to limit the coming climate catastrophe.

Our God, we pray for transformation of hearts and minds, for the stones of indifference to become hearts of compassion, for the stones of anxiety to become hearts of hope. In your name we pray, Amen. (from Christian Aid)
