



From the Chaplain....

'You're going to have a baby!' the angel said to Mary. I don't know any teenage girls who wouldn't have found that challenging, and that's without factoring in the particular cultural expectations of the time. Becoming an unmarried mother and being ostracised from friends and society would not have been what Mary had planned and hoped for herself. But within a short time and with a visit to her cousin Elizabeth, Mary was responding with words of joy: 'My heart praises the Lord; my soul is glad because of God my Saviour,' she sings. How was it that she was able to respond so positively to such life-changing news?

We can make plans and set ourselves goals, but we know all too well that we can't decide or control everything that happens to us in life. The last couple of years have made that painfully clear, with any plans we make being subject to constantly changing restrictions. Even now, we are having to scrap or rearrange or put on hold plans for Christmas celebrations and many of us daren't even consider future holidays abroad yet. For some of us, that is incredibly stressful: we are struggling with not having information that we can rely on. For some, it is causing us to despair: will we ever be free of the restrictions and able to relax and spend time with our friends and families again in the way we enjoy? But few of us are rejoicing as Mary did!

Perhaps one of Mary's secrets was the ability to see the 'bigger picture'. Rather than worrying about the things she couldn't change in her own life, and asking where God was in her personal story, she was aware of the part she was being invited to play in God's much larger story... a story which is still unfolding today.

For those of you, like me, who find yourselves struggling with all the unknowns in a life which is constantly shifting at the moment; perhaps we could do well to pray the Serenity Prayer by Reinhold Niebuhr and to remember with Mary that each one of us is invited to play a part in a story which has been unfolding for centuries before us and which is not yet complete, but in which all things shall be well in the end.

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and wisdom to know the difference.
