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From the Chaplain....

'Lord have mercy', 'Christ have mercy' say the congregation together as part of their confession during a traditional church service. But what is mercy?

According to the dictionary, mercy is 'compassion or forgiveness shown towards someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm'. This might involve forgiving someone who deserves to be punished, but it might also be intentionally showing compassion towards someone who would otherwise suffer through our lack of involvement. We will be encouraging each other in the latter over our harvest appeal as we collect much-needed donations for our local foodbanks. It is our belief that we are all created to live together in harmony and that we have a responsibility towards one another in the community where we live and work.

So what about forgiveness? 'What makes it difficult for us to forgive?' I asked my pupils this morning. 'The anger and the hurt we feel', came the answer. We all know the difficulty of letting go of the hurt caused when we have been unfairly treated by others: none of us find this easy. Knowing that the anger and inability to forgive is probably hurting us more than the person who has wronged us, doesn't necessarily make it any easier. So how can we move on and build more positive and peaceful bonds where relationships have broken down?

In our Bible story this week (John 8:1-11) Jesus was approached by men who demanded a sinner be punished. Instead of putting himself in the place of judge, Jesus asked them to consider which of them had never sinned. Slowly the group dispersed until no-one was left to accuse. A little honest recognition of our own failings might help us to be more compassionate towards others who get things wrong. As we practise working out our differences day by day here at school, we try to go one step further, to put ourselves in one another's shoes and to listen to one another's views. Admittedly, where there is deep hurt it can sometimes take a while before we are ready to engage with this process. But when we are able to put aside our anger and really listen, with the purpose of understanding and not of persuading, it can make a world of difference. The gift we offer the other, of our time and our attention, shows them that they are valued; and the walls of hostility begin to tumble down. The things we learn about one another during this process can change our whole way of seeing each other, and open up the possibility for an unimagined hope for the future.

As exemplified by the stories told by Mr Green in house worship this week, where we can find the grace to reach out in compassion and in hope, the result can be a deep peace and a blessing for both parties.

This week we have considered the difference it makes when we show mercy and forgiveness.
