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



All we ask is that they are nutritionally balanced e.g., Main meal and dessert, hot wrap and flapjack or a baguette and a drink.



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
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#### **Earthquake Appeal**

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#### From the Chaplain....

'Mission Impossible?' is the theme for our worship this week. As Jonah headed into the great and evil city of Nineveh, he was probably convinced he would not live to see his family again. The chances of anyone there listening to his message must have seemed close to zero. And yet mysteriously, they did listen. Not only did they listen, but they repented; every single one of them. Everyone in Nineveh, from the greatest to the least, from the King to the cattle, fasted and wore sack cloth and prayed for mercy. Once again, God was able to show the power of his Spirit at work in a miraculous way that simply can't be explained by human efforts alone. As the news has unfolded this week, our screens have been filled with pictures and stories of devastation and tragedy in Syria and Turkey: people grieving and people lost, collapsed buildings and shattered lives and rescue workers overwhelmed by the sheer scale of the task they are faced with.

And yet even amid the terrible chaos and hardship, there are chinks of light, glimpses of God's Spirit at work. Countries from all around the world are sending rescue workers to help with the mammoth task of searching for survivors; a mother and newborn baby were rescued just this morning after nearly 100 hours trapped under rubble; strangers comfort one another and people of all walks of life are moved to do what they can to help. We can't take away the grief and the suffering but whatever little we can offer, God will use and multiply.

#### A prayer from Christian Aid

God of time and space, we cry to you for your children - our neighbours - in southern Turkey and northern Syria, following the earthquake that has devastated hundreds of lives. Only they and you know what it is like to experience such trauma in the middle of the night.

We give thanks for the aid that is already being given and for the promises of help that have been made by many nations. Comfort, we pray, those who are trapped in collapsed buildings; those who have lost loved ones; those who wait for news and those digging through rubble to save others.

Grant the gift of hope so that those caught between life and death know that you are with them and that others are ready to support them as they seek a future that overshadows the experiences of today.

We ask this in the Name of Jesus, who endured so much for love of them. Amen
