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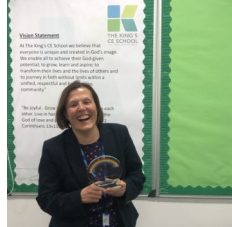
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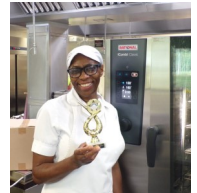
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Congratulations to our Award Winners

We are proud to announce that The King's CE School are the city winners of the Inclusive Award, in recognition of the whole school approach to supporting pupils and families during lockdown.



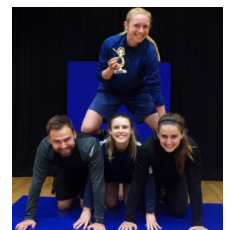
Congratulations to Mrs Jones who was nominated for an award in the ConnectEd Rainbow 2020-21 award ceremony in Bright Star Category.

Thank you to everyone involved for supporting our students, and to Ms Arnold for organising the event.



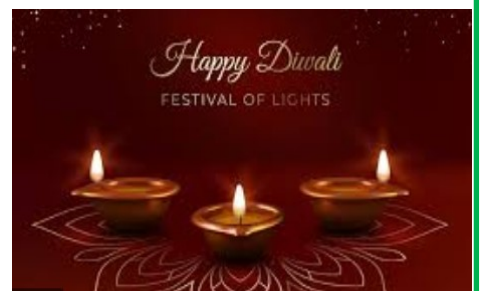
Lockers

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Year 10 Online Parents' Evening – Wednesday 10th November 2021 – 6-8pm

Dear Parent/Carer

We are keen to work closely with Parents/Carers to support and secure the best outcomes for every child in Year 10 and your online attendance at the Parents' Evening is critical in ensuring we work together to ensure your child makes as much progress as possible throughout KS4. As we are currently unable to meet face-to-face in school we are using our **online appointment booking system** called School Cloud.

This is a very important date in the school calendar as it is an important time in Year 10 and is the opportunity to meet subject teachers to discuss how your son/daughter is progressing in their learning. As part of the progress conversations teachers will discuss how best pupils can secure positive outcomes.

The online appointment booking system, School Cloud, allows you to choose your own 5 minute appointment times with subject teachers and you will receive an email confirming your appointments. Please be aware that we have to limit the number of appointments each subject teacher can make within the two hour time slot so please book as soon as possible.

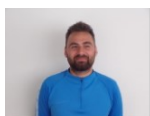
As we are holding online appointments, lasting exactly 5 minutes (there will be a countdown so you are aware when the meeting will automatically close), we would kindly ask that you:

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From the Chaplain....

I had an interesting discussion with my tutor group this morning about whether God really would forgive anything and anyone, no matter how bad the crime they had committed. Despite our own difficulties forgiving others, most of the pupils agreed that God probably would forgive even the worst offences, as long as the person recognised that they had done wrong and regretted it. One pupil commented about how strange it would be to see Hitler in heaven and another doubted that Hitler would ever recognise he was in the wrong.

The question of whether we truly believe that God's love and forgiveness is for all, is a really challenging one. When we are hurt by someone else's behaviour, we find it difficult to forgive. When we are disappointed in ourselves and the way we have acted or reacted towards others, we can also find it extremely difficult to forgive ourselves. Do we limit God's ability to forgive because of our own inability to let go? Do we perhaps need to start by finding a way to love ourselves?

When it comes down to it, forgiveness is an act of grace... it cannot really be earned or deserved, and neither can we travel back in time to undo the hurt we have caused. Forgiveness relies on love, a desire to mend the broken relationship and no little trust that things can be better in the future. It is about being prepared to leave behind the hurt of the past and look forward with hope to a more positive relationship. For us humans, an awareness of our own flaws can often help us to be more generous towards others. But how does this help us understand God's ability to forgive?

One of my deepest convictions is that God is love: He can do no other than to love us completely and He desires nothing more than for us to flourish and be joyful in the lives he has given us and in our relationships with him and with one another. For me, this deep love of God for all his children overrides everything else that I might know or think I know about God and is the lens through which I recognise God at work in the world around me.
