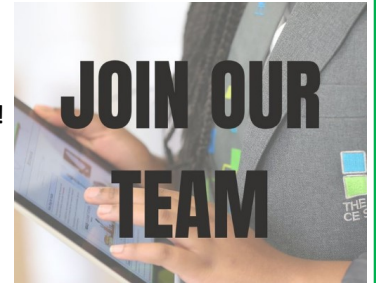

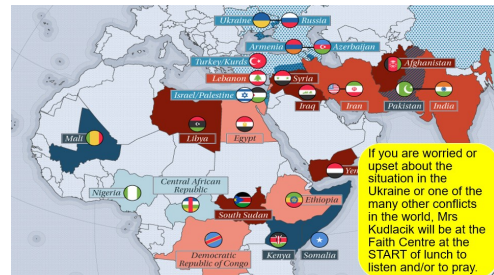
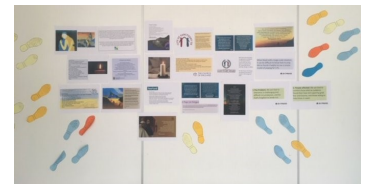

We were delighted to welcome our new September 2022 Year 7 pupils and their families into school on Tuesday evening for talks and activities. There was a fantastic atmosphere around school.

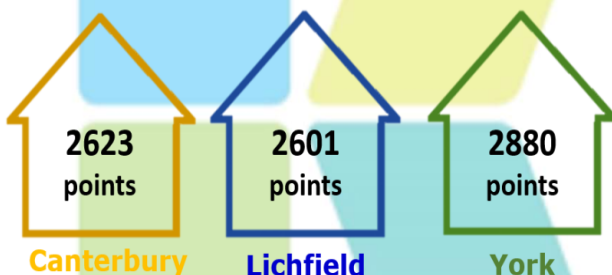


Our student leaders represented the school superbly when they welcomed our new Year 7 cohort for September 2022.

Thursday 17th March—Year 7 & Boys Wolverhampton City Volleyball Competition:

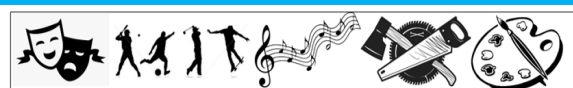

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From the Chaplain....

This week we have been reflecting on one of Jesus' parables:

"A man had a fig tree growing in his vineyard, and he went to look for fruit on it but did not find any. So he said to the man who took care of the vineyard, 'For three years now I've been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and haven't found any. Cut it down! Why should it use up the soil?' "Sir,' the man replied, 'leave it alone for one more year, and I'll dig around it and fertilize it. If it bears fruit next year, fine! If not, then cut it down.'" Luke 13:6-9

I wonder as you read the parable, who you most identified with?

Perhaps you felt empathy for the vineyard owner, whose resources are being taken up by a tree which is not bearing fruit. Where in our lives are we spending our energy and not seeing any results? Is it time to cut back on an activity which leaves us feeling drained and frustrated?

Perhaps you empathised with the gardener, whose patience, generosity and optimism lead him to plead on behalf of the tree for one last chance. Is there a person in your life who needs someone to speak up for them? Who do you know that needs to know someone believes in them? On what do we pin our own hope for the future, and who might we share that with?

Or perhaps you saw yourself as the unfruitful tree. So much of life has been put on hold in the last couple of years and there has been little certainty on which to make our plans. Are we feeling that our lives aren't progressing or struggling to feel hope for our own futures? As a society and as individuals we find it difficult to be patient; we are much more inclined to instant gratification than to the discipline of waiting. Yet God's timing is not our timing, his ways are beyond our ways and his thoughts higher than our thoughts. Let us be patient with ourselves and with him as we remember his promise to us:

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

As our gardens come back to life after the long, dark winter months and as new green shoots start to appear, let's look with hope and gratitude for the signs of God at work in our lives and in our community.
