From the Chaplain...

Our worship theme this week at school is taken from our school vision: to 'journey in faith without limits', and we have been blessed with the opportunity to listen and reflect on the physical and metaphorical journeys that have brought some of our colleagues and students to this particular time and place. 'What encourage us to have faith and to believe that God wants the best for us?' is the question we have been asking ourselves.

On a more mundane and everyday level, I have been travelling to work this week in the direction of the rising sun... just at the time of day when it first appears over the horizon. Even before the sun can be seen, the sky ahead of me has been bright in anticipation, whereas a glance in my rear-view mirror shows a gloomy night sky behind me. In fact, as my journey progresses and the sun starts to make its presence known, even clouds glow with silver linings and even muddy fields shimmer in the first rays. In the light of the morning sun, everything is transformed and looks better; more hopeful.



For me, there is a metaphor here about our journey in faith. There are times in life when we get distracted or lose our way. We can find ourselves heading down paths that do not lead to God and suddenly life can seem quite dark and hopeless, full of uncertainty and danger. Wherever we find ourselves, God never abandons us. We only need to turn back towards him for the light of his love to start to make a difference in our lives again. Even the parts of our lives which cast shadows (like the clouds on my journey) or the places in life where we get stuck (like the muddy fields) are transformed and start to shine with potential in the light of his love.

Our paths may not be straight, there may be times when we feel on top of the world and can clearly see the light but at other times we travel through valleys from which we have to rely on the promise of hope offered by no more than a brighter horizon. The light of God's love, whether we can feel it directly or just experience it reflected from other people for the moment, will give us direction, confidence and encouragement as we travel one step at a time into the future.

As we prepare for our school Act of Remembrance tomorrow, we are all too aware of the many conflicts in our world at this time and perhaps most particularly of the escalating crisis in Palestine and Israel. We pray that all God's people might know the hope of his peace and welcome his Spirit

of mercy, compassion and healing.
