Dear Parents and Carers

The final week of the Autumn term is always a special one for us at The King's as we take time to celebrate Christmas. Although we have had to make some adjustments, we did manage to hold our Christmas Concert, We The King's, face to face. It was a great evening with pupils in every year group performing alongside the Christmas readings. We all enjoyed the Christmas dinner on Tuesday and were very pleased to receive a visit from the Bishop of Lichfield on Wednesday. Our year 7s took part in the Christingle service at Christ Church in Tettenhall and today we have all joined together on TEAMS for our Christmas Service that we filmed at our parish church, St Michael and All Angels earlier this week.

So we come to the end of the Autumn term. It has been a busy term and we are fortunate that we have had minimal disruption to our teaching and learning from the Covid pandemic. However as we break up for the Christmas we are very aware of the record breaking number of new cases each day and the concerns regarding the new variants. You will have a received a letter from me, earlier this week, giving the details for the beginning of term and the arrangements for the lateral flow testing of all the pupils who have parental consent. The lateral flow testing really does help us as a school community to keep safe and avoid outbreaks. Thank you for your support with this and please do reconsider giving consent if you have not yet done so.

The NHS is encouraging everyone eligible for their first, second or Covid-19 booster jab to walk-in and 'grab a jab' this weekend, to protect themselves and help make the Christmas period safer for us all.

There are 100 sites across the Black Country and West Birmingham, all are offering first, second and booster doses for adults aged 18 and over, as well as vaccines for 12-15-year-olds.

Walk-in jabs, without an appointment, are also available at a number of vaccination sites across the area including the Mander Centre, WV Active Bilston-Bert Williams, the Civic Centre (from tomorrow) and The Hub at Ashmore Park from Saturday. 






From the Chaplain....

Have you ever wondered, if Jesus were born today, where God would choose as the setting and which characters would be there to witness his birth?

Bethlehem was likely to have been very much smaller than the term 'City of David' suggests; probably little more than an unwalled village of some one hundred inhabitants, a few miles south of Jerusalem. In fact the whole province of Judea would have been a small and barely significant Roman outpost; its position as a buffer against the Parthian Empire more useful than the tiny contribution it made to the Roman treasury. We may well be able to name several small territories today who long for independence from the powers they feel govern them against their will.

Mary and Joseph, Jesus' earthly family, were not members of a rich dynasty who could provide stability and comfort for God's son. Mary was a young unmarried mother, shunned by polite society and according to Matthew's gospel this new little family would spend at least part of Jesus' early life living as refugees in Egypt. I wonder how welcome they were made there? It's hard to imagine they might have been faced with the detention centres, under-staffed camps and harsh interrogations imposed on those fleeing persecution today.

Luke tells us that the first people to visit the new born child were shepherds from the nearby field; rough men who lived harsh lives out with their sheep, fending off wild animals and with no way to keep clean. We have no doubt passed rough sleepers in the streets of our city but I wonder how we would react if they knocked on our doors wanting to visit the youngest member of our own family?

The nativity scenes we display or act out at this time of year never seem to represent the chaos, the smell, the dirt and the 'ordinariness' of that first Christmas. But God didn't choose to stay all comfortable and remote in the luxury of heaven; he reached down in the dark of night and crept in beside humanity in the messiness and disorder of our lives that whatever dark place we might find ourselves in, we might not be alone.
