Dear Parents and Carers

I am delighted to share the outcome from our recent SIAMS inspection that The King's has been recognised as an Excellent Church of England school. The SIAMS inspection is an Ofsted Section 48 inspection that all schools designated as having a religious character have to undergo on a regular basis.

The purpose of the SIAMS inspection is to evaluate how effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?"

The inspector, who visited The King's the week before the May half term break, found "leaders have infused the school with a deeply Christian vision that is unforced, ever present, spontaneous yet intentional". Another key finding is "Staff including governors create excellent partnerships that transform lives. This enables all pupils to be agents of change and show compassion for God's world."

The report commends the "superb support provided by the well co-ordinated school SEND Team", the "incredible work of the EAL team" and recognises "the remarkable work of the whole staff to create a School of Sanctuary".

The inspector concludes that "The vision of this truly Christian yet very diverse community is experienced in all aspects of school life. This enables all to not only flourish but to be transformed." The report celebrates our unified, harmonious and respectful school community, the hard work and commitment of all our staff and pupils, the support and challenge from our governing body and the partnership with yourselves as parents and carers.

I do want to congratulate and thank everyone in the school community. We are greatly encouraged by the outcome and are committed to developing further to ensure we serve all in our school community. This report, along with the positive Ofsted monitoring report from February, will inform our discussions on the staff development day on Monday 27th June, when we will be working on next year's development plan.

Risk Assessments

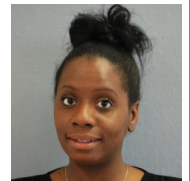
If your child has an injury which may impact on them moving around school, a risk assessment must be completed with Mrs Badger before they should return to school.

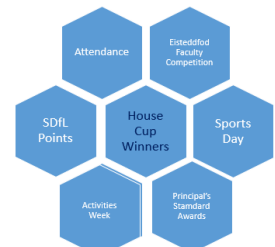

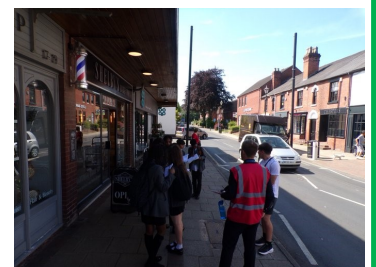


Lost Property

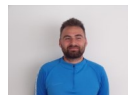

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From the Chaplain....

We start an exciting new series this week, looking at the stories of 'Courageous Advocates' from both the Old and New Testaments: people who had the courage to take a risk, to keep trusting, to speak up for what they believed to be right or to move on from past failures. This week's character is Hannah, who kept praying for a child and trusting God despite enduring years of disappointment and of bullying. We have been asking the questions, 'Where does our hope come from? Who or what encourages us to keep trusting that all shall be well in the end?'

We have all faced previously unimaginable uncertainty and challenges in the last couple of years and had to deal with the frustrations and disappointments of cancellations and restrictions. We know how it feels when life doesn't follow the path we had planned or when doors of opportunity close to us and we are forced to re-assess our hopes and dreams. Mrs Kaur told us this week a story of incredible resilience; the story of Kieren Behan, the first Irish gymnast to compete at the Olympic Games, despite his years of training being interrupted by illness, surgery, accident and even being told he would never walk again. His hopeful persistence and hard work eventually paid off when he represented his country at the 2012 games and then won a silver medal in Rio in 2016!

The Bible, the story of God at work in the world, is full of human beings who have made mistakes and bad decisions, faced impossible situations or simply had flawed characters, which marked them out as unlikely partners in God's work. Jesus' own genealogy contains several unlikely characters: gentiles, enemies of the Jews and illegitimate children. But again and again, despite the challenges, God works through all manner of human beings to do something amazing and unbelievable.

Of course, being human, our time scale is very different to God's and it is easy for us to get impatient as we wait for his promises to be fulfilled. We might well look at our lives and wonder where he is and what he is doing. But God's story is so much broader and longer than just our own lives. As Peter writes (2 Peter 3:8) *'Do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day.'* Let's pray that our eyes are open to every little sign of God at work in and around us and may they be an encouragement to us as we continue to trust and encourage one another with the hope of his promises yet to be fulfilled.
