





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From the Chaplain....

Saul was sure he was right. He was a zealous Jew, he know the scriptures by heart and he followed all the laws and strict religious rules. So when he heard about this new group of men and women who were following a man called 'Jesus', a man who had beeb into the temple and turned over tables, a man who had claimed to be God...Saul was furious. Not only were they clearly wrong, in his opinion, but their teaching and their popularity was threaten-

ing to undermining the authority of the Jewish leaders and temple guards. There was a real risk that if things were allowed to continue, the Romans would see the Jewish leaders as weak and take back control into their own hands and that would not be stopped and he was the man to do it.

So why was it that God chose Saul (later known as Paul) to be the man who would spread his message among Jews and Gentiles, right across the Mediterranean? A message that Jesus was indeed God's Son and that his way was indeed the way to salvation and eternal life? Sometimes God chooses the person we thing is least qualified for the job, because he sees in them a potential we have missed. Sometimes God wants to show just what a transformation is possible in his grace and power.



Our school vision states that we enable all to transform their lives and the lives of others. A wonderful aim but also a challenge, if we are honest. As we give our pupils choices and as they learn from the consequences of the choices they make, we are challenged each day to leave past mistakes behind and to greet our students and one another with a clean slate; to see the potential in each individual and not to limit our expectations based on past experience. How do we communicate this to our pupils? How do we let them know that the past is forgotten and that every day they are free to be the person God created them to be? A person who is curious, creative, confidenta and fulfilled? And what about us, are willing to leave behind the person we have been, the bad experiences we have lived through and the mistakes we have made and become the person we were created to be? Are we willing to listen with open minds and admit when we have been wrong?

Because Saul was willing to hear and accept the terrible wrongs he had done, he was offered hope and a way forwards. It meant some humility and some acceptance of help from others. It meant leaving behind all that he had relied on and believed to be important in the past. But in return, God would use him in ways that neither hen or the other apostles could ever have foreseen as he travelled form country to country connecting with people and seeing other lives transformed.
