

Here at the King's CE School we have been very aware of the many conflicts around the world including the most recent war in the Ukraine. Members of our school community have links with several places where there is fighting or oppression and we continue to work to offer a welcome to all, including many refugees.

On Wednesday morning we held a samosa and cake sale at break time in order to raise money for Wolverhampton City of Sanctuary, who provide support to refugees and asylum seekers locally, and for the Red Cross, who work to meet urgent needs in places of conflict and where people are displaced. Thank you to Mrs Manser and the sixth formers who organised the sale and to all who brought in the cakes we all enjoyed eating: £190 has been raised so far.





Before lunch we paused as a school to pray for peace, for the safety of those fleeing aggression and that we might be courageous and generous in helping to support and welcome those who need it.

Then each member of the school was invited to reflect and to take part in the telling of their own story and the story of their family. We recognise and value that our communal story, the story of the King's School, is made up of each and every one of the stories of the individual members of our school. Our stories will be put together and displayed soon under the banner 'Your Story is Our Story; the King's Story'.

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From the Chaplain....

The story of the Lost Son is a beautiful illustration of grace: the outpouring of undeserved blessings. In this particular parable told by Jesus, grace takes the form of forgiveness and love, modelling the unconditional and undeserved love that God offers each one of us. And what a difference that forgiveness and love make in our lives!

This week I have been fortunate to take part in House Worship led by our Year 10 pupils as they have retold the story of the Lost Son and reflected on the power of forgiveness. None of us is perfect; all of us make mistakes and often there is no way of putting things back to the way they were: the damage has been caused. That doesn't mean we can't repair the relationship and move forwards in hope to a better way of being with one another, but this can only happen where forgiveness is possible. If we can't forgive then we are stuck in the place of hurt, unable to move on. And if we can't receive forgiveness, then we are stuck in a place of shame and judgement, unable to see a hopeful and positive way forwards.

In the King's School, when we take part in Restorative Practice, we are looking for a more hopeful way forwards together and a repairing of a relationship in which harm has been caused and offense has been taken. Grace and mercy are at the very centre of the conversation which takes place. If we enter the conversation wanting only to be heard and to demand justice, but unprepared to hear the other, then there is no space for understanding, compassion and hope. But when the restoration of the relationship is valued above the loss and the hurt that has been caused, then the miracle of forgiveness and healing can take place.

This is what God offers us. No matter what hurt we cause to him, to others or to ourselves, he loves us enough to take the pain and to turn back to us with open arms, just waiting for us to turn to him and to accept his love. Our God can do no other than to love. Our God **is** love.

May we all be ready to accept the blessings bestowed on us this week, and might we in turn be quicker to offer the grace and hope of forgiveness and restoration.
