

From the Chaplain...

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

God's people had suffered a great disappointment. Their country, the land God had brought them to that they might inhabit it and flourish, had been invaded by foreign powers: their brightest young adults had been taken into exile to serve a foreign economy, their homes had been burnt down, their temple lay in ruins and their nation was scattered. Had God abandoned them? Was God punishing them? And if so, how long would God's anger last? God's people were living through a time of despair and the prophet Jeremiah could offer no immediate promise of restoration.

As we look around our world today we too might feel discouraged. Across the globe countries are experiencing changed weather patterns meaning that crops are failing and whole communities are starving. Meanwhile unexpected levels of drought or flooding are destroying homes and economies and forcing mass migration whilst other locations are devastated by wildfires. On top of the environmental challenges facing the human race there are countries locked in conflict with no sign of peaceful solutions... often with the most vulnerable being caught at the centre of the violence and suffering. Closer to home we see families struggling to feed and clothe their children, we see loneliness among the elderly and infirm and we hear stories of the huge risks taken by people simply seeking a safe place to live. We too might well ask, 'Has God abandoned us? Are we being punished?'

Jeremiah's message to God's people was that there would be no immediate reprieve, in fact their exile would last for seventy years BUT that certainly didn't mean that God had forgotten them. God had a plan for his people and it was a plan to bless them in generous abundance. One day, in God's own time, that plan would be revealed.

Whether we are despairing about the state of our nation, the wider world or events in our own lives, we too are called to patience and trust. Jeremiah's words are a comfort to us today as they were to those who lived 2800 years before us: we are not forgotten, we are loved. Can we continue to trust and hope? Can we hold on to our faith in a God whose timescale in not ours and who is not limited in his imagination or power in the ways that we are? Can we live our lives, day by day, in the belief and knowledge that God is already at work among us, sowing the seeds of his kingdom to come even in the darkest places, even in the midst of despair? And as we continue to pray and trust, can we keep our eyes open for the signs at God at work in our communities, and be ready with the courage and the will to join in with his work wherever we discern him?

"Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." Jeremiah 29:12-13
