

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From the Chaplain....

Having focussed last week on the hope of advent, we now consider joy. Our Bible passage this week is the 'Magnificat' or Mary's song of joy and praise to a God who has not forgotten her and who in working out his wonderful purpose for the world is involving even her. At this stage Mary is still a teenager, she is unmarried and the news of her pregnancy could well cause Joseph to break off their engagement. She will certainly suffer from cruel comments and she even risks being stoned to death for her assumed promiscuity. But her relative Elizabeth confirms that Mary's child will indeed be a gift from God and destined to play a central role in God's plans, enabling Mary to overcome any dread of the difficulties she faces and to look ahead with joy and trust to the fulfilment of God's amazing plans; plans for justice, peace and life for his people.

So what is the source of this deep joy of Mary's and of other people who remain optimistic despite suffering and setbacks? I would like to suggest that our joy in difficult circumstances springs from our faith in a God who we believe to be all powerful and to love us completely; a God who we trust to be actively at work and to have a plan for our ultimate well-being. And on what do we base this trust? As we look back through our lives we notice that God has been with us. We see how he has brought us through hardship in years gone by, how he has used our experiences to form our character, how he has developed our skills and understanding to become the people we are today; to carry out the work, to face the situations and to help the people we encounter in our lives today. Sharing the news of what God has been doing in our lives, as Mary and Elizabeth did, can be a source of joy and encouragement for others too.

We may not be happy all the time; we may sometimes lament the plight of our planet and its people, we may grieve with those who suffer, but even in our darkest days the deep joy that comes from our faith in a loving God is a light which is never put out. And so, as St Paul says in his second letter to the Corinthians (2 Cor 13:11) and as we say in our school verse: *Be joyful. Grow to maturity. Encourage each other. Live in harmony and peace. Then the God of love and peace will be with you.*
