

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
#### **English Week**


















Mr Green has also been running a competition based on his display of vintage books. He has invited Yr 7 pupils to email him about this book:

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#### From the Chaplain....

"Perhaps one day you will become a preacher," they said to me.

'There is no way that is ever going to happen,' I thought. 'I am too shy. My voice is too quiet. And anyway, I have nothing to say.'

It would be twenty years before I thought again and started to explore the vocation of Methodist Local Preacher. And another five years before I was finally accredited. Amazingly, and much to my surprise, I really enjoy it!

"No!" we can almost hear Jonah shouting as he covers his ears and runs in the opposite direction. Our Bible reading this week is the first in a six-week series looking at the book of Jonah and all that it has to teach us, and I think we can all empathise with Jonah not wanting to go to the great, heathen city of Nineveh and tell them to change their ways or they will incur God's wrath. They weren't even Jews, so why would they listen to him anyway? And they were renowned for their particularly evil and violent behaviour. We have all had to face tasks we didn't want to do at times, but few of us have been asked to risk our lives in order to complete them.

Jonah goes to some lengths to avoid God's call, even boarding a ship bound for the other end of the known world at the time (Spain!). But he hasn't counted on God's power and he hasn't counted on God being inescapable. As the psalmist wrote: Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast. (Psalm 139)

As we follow Jonah's story over the next few weeks we will encounter a God who doesn't abandon us when we turn our backs on him, a God who is there to protect us even though we may go through tough times and a God who ultimately loves us and wants to love other people through us. We might not always hear his call, we might not always listen and pay attention to his call, but he is patient and he won't stop calling until we do!
