It has been wonderful welcoming our students back after our half-term break and it has been a busy start to the half-term with lots of exciting things taking place this week. 
Our Lent Appeal

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

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From the Chaplain....

Are you a rule follower? And if you answered 'yes', how do you feel about those people who break the rules? Do you ever find yourself feeling a bit smug and superior to them? Or do you feel like you are wasting your time because other people don't seem to bother?

God's people Israel had returned from exile in Babylonia, and they were keen to show that they were righteous in their observance of religious laws and traditions. They took fasting particularly seriously: they put on sackcloth and bowed their heads low in prayer. Yet they felt that God hadn't noticed their efforts, so what did he want from them? The prophet's instructions to the people in our reading this week (Isaiah 58) were to create a just and fair society, where all people were valued and treated with dignity. God was not interested in outward shows of loyalty or religiosity but in people's hearts; and this was evident from the way they treated one another, and in particular from the way they treated the most vulnerable members of society.

So where are the greatest injustices in our own society and are we doing anything about them? Or is it easier for us complain about the unfairness whilst expecting someone else to deal with it?

Did you know:

- 1 in 10 people globally don't have clean water close to home.
- A child under the age of 5 dies every 2 minutes because of disease from unclean water and poor toilets?
- Every minute a new born dies from infection because of an unclean environment and lack of clean water?

Our Lent Appeal this year is for Water Aid. Over the next few weeks we will be praying for those people in the world who do not have access to clean water and raising money to make a difference.

As we turn back to God during lent and refocus on his ways and priorities, I invite you to join us in our prayers and our fundraising, that somewhere in the world lives might be changed, deaths might be avoided and hope might be born.

Jesus, source of living water, we pray for all those who do not have access to clean drinking water or safe toilets. Purify, protect, and multiply their water sources, that they may enjoy the full and healthy lives that we take for granted. Give us generous hearts to do what we can to make things fair. Amen
