

The school recently had a Section 5 inspection from Ofsted in November 2022. The report judged provision at The King's to be 'Good' in all six inspection areas and recognised that there is a well-planned curriculum which is broad and ambitious for all pupils, including those with SEND, and that pupils learn well, concentrating in lessons and taking pride in their work. The report states that 'staff go the extra mile to help pupils'.

In addition to Ofsted, in May 2022, The King's was officially judged an Excellent Church of England school following a SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection. It evaluated how effective the school's distinctive Christian vision is in enabling pupils and adults to flourish. The school received an overall grade of Excellent, with both the impact

of collective worship and the effectiveness of religious education (RE) judged to be Excellent.

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From the Chaplain....

Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples,' says the risen Christ in Matthew 28:19. These are among his last words to his disciples, before he ascends into heaven. What a daunting challenge to leave this small band of followers!

And there are days when we too are faced with a daunting or ambitious challenge; when expectations of our achievements might exceed the confidence we have in our own abilities or when we simply feel that those setting the expectations don't understand the demands of our daily lives.

Over the next few weeks in our worship calendar, we will be taking a closer look at some of Jesus' followers who were 'sent out' to use their gifts and to witness to his power and love through their words and their actions: sent out to leave behind their comfort zones, sent out in trust and in the power of the Holy Spirit of God, sent out to make a difference in people's lives.

The command to go to 'all peoples everywhere' reminds us that God's love is not exclusive, but for all. God is not limited by race, culture or religion. He is not limited by age, gender or sexuality. God takes no account of social norms or assumptions. Indeed, in the words of Paul in his letter to the Romans: Nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)

So, from where do we get the confidence to carry out the difficult command of loving all people and to face up to the daunting challenges we meet in our own lives, day by day? Jesus ends his final instructions to his disciples by saying to them: And I will be with you always, to the end of the age (Matthew 28: 20). And his promise holds true for us too. We are not left alone, but invite'd into a living relationship with God, in which his Spirit works with our spirits to carry out his plan. As we learn to walk with him and put our trust in him, again and again God proves his faithfulness to us and puts his trust in us. His Spirit fills our hearts with unexpected joy, provides the inspiration we need when our own imaginations fail us, floods us with the deep peace that comes from knowing that we are loved and reminds us again and again of his promise that 'all shall be well'.
