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From the Chaplain....

For the last week in our series of 'God's plan in creation' we consider what it means to be 'created to love'. We read that we are 'created in God's image (Genesis 1) and also that 'God is love' (1 John 4): so what is love? Much used both in the Bible and in our everyday language, love has many different meanings, but Paul's first letter to the Corinthians sums it up well:

'Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not selfseeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.'

We know that there is much in human behaviour that is lacking in love. We have witnessed, in our lives or on the news, incidents of bullying, of injustice and of hatred. So if the best of human behaviour springs out of love, where does the worst of human behaviour come from? I would like to suggest that it comes from a place of fear: fear of the unknown, fear of losing control, fear of being judged and found wanting.

There is much to fear or make us anxious in our lives but our text this week reminds us that 'There is no fear in love. Perfect love drives out fear' and in fact Jesus repeated again and again to his followers the words 'Do not be afraid' and 'Do not worry' as well as the instruction to 'Love one another'. But what is the source of the love which we are asked to live by?

According to 1 John 4 'we love because God first loved us'. Indeed, our whole understanding of love comes from the love that we have first received and experienced from God and from others. God, who created the whole universe, the whole of time and space, loved us enough to die for us and that amazing gift of love is transformational, enabling us to become the people we were created to be: people created in the image of God himself. So the challenge for us this week is to accept the love we are offered and to allow that love to transform us, day by day, into people who are able to fully love others.

A prayer from the Centre for Action and Contemplation

God, Lord of all creation, lover of life and of everything, please help us to love in our very small way what You love infinitely and everywhere...

Help us each day to stand for love, for healing, for good, for the diverse unity of the Body of Christ and all creation, because we know this is what You desire: as Jesus prayed, that all may be one.

We offer our prayer together with all the holy names of God, we offer our prayer together with Christ, our Lord.
