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From the Chaplain....

One of the quotes I would most like to see on classroom walls is attributed to Giacomo Casonova, "The one who makes no mistakes makes nothing." And most of us would agree, wouldn't we, that we have learnt far more from making mistakes than we have from the times when everything went according to plan. Indeed, one of our most cherished values at The King's CE School is forgiveness because, difficult as it is, we recognise that we have all made mistakes and we have all been in need of forgiveness at times. Indeed it is through forgiveness and a repairing of relationships that we have hope for the future. If we were to all carry round with us a burden of guilt for every wrong choice we had ever made, what a terrible experience of life that would be!

Chapter 3 of the book of Jonah begins as an almost exact copy of Chapter 1, but this time when the Lord speaks to Jonah and sends him to the great city of Nineveh Jonah obeys and sets off in the right direction. I wonder what has changed? Certainly not the city of Nineveh; the people there are still evil, violent and the enemies of Israel. Neither has God's word changed, he is still asking Jonah to go and warn the people of Nineveh that God will destroy their city as a result of their evil deeds. But through his experience in the storm and in the belly of the whale, something has changed Jonah himself. He has had an experience of God's grace, he has been saved from a certain death in the stormy seas and he is now ready to obey God's commands. And because he is given a second chance, hundreds of thousands of lives will be saved. A whole city will stop killing and turn to God in humility and repentance. The people of Nineveh will also get a second chance for life and prosperity.

'Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us,' Jesus taught his disciples to pray. Are we to forgive because we have been forgiven or in order that we might be forgiven? Both may well be true. What is certain is that we have a God who forgives us in ways we neither deserve nor could ever merit. As his children, made in his image, he calls us to do the same.
