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From the Chaplain....

Happy New Year everyone and a Happy Epiphany! Epiphany is the church season which starts on 6th January and it is all about God revealing himself to humankind through Jesus. The traditional Bible reading for this time of year is the story of the visitors from the East; wise and learned travellers who, having seen a new star and read the prophecies, gave up the comfort of their homes and surroundings to make a difficult and dangerous journey in search of the new King they believed had been born. And when they eventually found the child, these well respected foreign scholars were so overwhelmed that they knelt and worshipped him. This is just one story in many which has the God of Israel and Judah being recognised by 'outsiders'. Our God has no limits.

Our Bible text at school this week has been the story of Simeon and Anna: elderly Jews who had been praying and waiting in trust their whole lives for God to send his Messiah. It is hard to imagine keeping hopeful for that length of time and I wonder what kept them going. As Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus into the temple that day, one young family in the thousands that must have come for the same rite of passage over the decades they had been waiting, what was it about this particular baby that caught their attention? How did they recognise the divine in this one child?

Perhaps it was precisely because of the years of prayer, the years they had spent with God, that Simeon and Anna were able to recognise him when he appeared. But what about us? Although Jesus is no longer walking the Earth in a human body, God is still actively present and working among us, and there are numerous Bible verses to suggest that God is living in us, in each one of his children. Our School vision states that 'we believe that we were created in God's image'. That is to say that we are carrying something of the essence of God in us. We might call that God's Spirit, living in our hearts and gradually transforming us into the people he created us to be.

My prayer for you in 2013 is that your eyes will be open to noticing God at work in you and in those around you, even in those people and places where you least expect to encounter him; and that when you see what he is doing, you will want to join in.
