




Benefits of a sandwich course:

DO YOU WANT A PROFESSIONAL COURSE?

These tend to be the best for people looking to land a job right out of University – but they are not great for those that do not know what they want to do.



DIFFERENT DEGREES, DIFFERENT JOBS.

All degrees offer a variety of careers, however if you know you are suited to a particular industry then it is important at this point to align your degree accordingly.




